Supporting Women's Leadership in Kalumburu

November, 2019

The Tramulla Strong Women's Group received funding from a Connect Groups 'Dream It Forward' grant to host a leadership workshop series in Kalumburu with Natasha Short from Kimberley Jiyigas.. This project was delivered in collaboration with Enterprise Partnerships WA.

The first workshop was held at the Strong Women's Centre and the second workshop was held at the Community Resource Centre.

21 women attend the workshops with Tramulla Strong Women's Group leaders, Margaret Peumora and Gertrude Waina, attending both days. The workshops aimed to support empowerment and leadership in women.

Women's Leadership Workshops

Across the two days, Natasha covered topics to support women's empowerment, both individually and collectively. Topics discussed included:

- Finding your unique gift and following your dream;
- Team work;
- Conflict resolution;
- Public speaking,;
- Respecting difference;
- Avoiding burn out;
- Lateral violence;
- Goal setting.

"Please bring this workshop back next year so we can learn from it. We want this leadership training to happen again because we want Aboriginal people standing on their own two feet in this community" (Workshop Participant)



Both afternoons following the workshops, Margaret led women on bush trips to collect bush tucker or to the coast to relax and continue yarning.
